Undergraduate Spotlight: **Barron Jackson, PC'21**



Barron Jackson, PC'21

Barron Jackson, PC'21 is a rising sophomore from Tulsa, Oklahoma. Barron has an infectious positive attitude and always lights up any room he enters. However, he has a lot more to be grateful for than the average person. One day during soccer practice, Barron suddenly collapsed and was rushed to the ER. After a series of tests over the course of several days, Barron was informed that there was an aneurysm that had ruptured in the front right part of his brain. Since he was only 15 years old at the time, many doctors were hesitant to perform the procedure on him, saying that the risk of death was too high. Thankfully, one brave doctor decided to operate on Barron. After 10 grueling hours, a clip was placed on the aneurysm and the surgery was complete.

Barron spent the next two weeks in the hospital recovering. However, Barron still lives with some of the repercussions of this procedure. He is now prone to seizures, having experienced six total since the surgery, but remains two years seizure-free as of May 2022. He remains very thankful for his family, friends, nurses, and doctors that got him through this traumatic experience. Barron remains a constant reminder to live every day to the fullest. Aside from being a role model Delt to his entire pledge class, Barron is a member of the rush team and oversees the recruitment of potential new members from Tulsa and Eastern Oklahoma. Along with being a part of rush team, Barron is PC 21's representative on the FAAR Committee.
